The Season of Lent



Lent is the season of preparation for Easter. It is a time of penance: purple vestments and altar frontal, no flowers in church. The Gloria will not be heard again until the Easter Vigil and the singing of the Exsultet.

As you prepare to encounter God in word and sacrament, you might want to take this opportunity to reflect on the Passion of Our Lord and His glorious Resurrection which follows it.

As you prepare yourself for this sacred encounter, meditate on the following acclamation:

"Lord, by your cross and resurrection, you have set us free. You are the Saviour of the world"

We say together the lines in Bold Type

The Preparation

A Hymn may be sung as the Priest and servers enter. We may make the Sign of the Cross as the priest welcomes and greets the people.

In the name of the Father, \blacksquare and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

We may say together the entrance antiphon on the other sheet

The Penitential Rite

The priest invites us to confess our sins. We confess them to God using these or similar words

The priest gives us God's absolution and we may make the Sign of the Cross to remind ourselves that it is through this that we are freed from our sin

God of mercy,

we acknowledge that we are all sinners. We turn from the wrong that we have thought and said and done, and are mindful of all that we have failed to do. For the sake of Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us for all that is past, and help us to live each day in the light of Christ our Lord. Amen

Or the priest may lead the confession with a series of petitions each of which ends with one of the following. Please repeat the petition.

Lord have mercy Christ have mercy Lord have mercy

or

Kyrie Eleison Christe Eleison Kyrie Eleison

The priest says the Collect or Opening Prayer, after which we may sit.

Liturgy of the Word At the end of the reading This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

We stand in preparation for the Gospel. A Hymn may be sung. We may make the Sign of the Cross as the Gospel is announced

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N*. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

At the end of the Gospel This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Homily

Creed

On Sundays and Solemnities we stand to reaffirm our Faith

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

The Offertory

A Hymn may be sung. Bread and wine are brought to the altar and offered by the We exchange a sign of peace. priest. A Collection may be taken. We respond to the words of offering if said aloud:

Blessed be God for ever.

Pray, my brothers and sisters, that this our sacrifice may be acceptable to God the almighty *we may stand* Father.

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his Church.

The priest then says the Prayer over the Gifts

The Liturgy of the Eucharist

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

The priest says the preface. We join in the words:

The priest continues with the Eucharistic prayer.

Christ is the bread of life: When we eat this bread and drink this cup we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, until you come in glory

At the end of the Eucharistic prayer

... for ever and ever. Amen. The Communion Rite

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done,

on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Deliver us, Lord, from every evil, and grant us peace in our day. In your mercy keep us free from sin and protect us from all anxiety as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our The priest may insert this prayer at this point Saviour, Jesus Christ.

For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share the one bread

As the bread is broken, all say together:

Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us.

Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us.

Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: grant us peace.

The priest invites us to receive communion with these or similar words:

This is the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

Communion is distributed. Please come forward to receive the Sacrament. If you would prefer to receive a blessing, please bring this sheet with you to signal this to the Priest. A Hymn may be sung.

The Dismissal

The priest leads us in a prayer of thanksgiving, followed by the parish notices and banns of marriage then a blessing is said and the Mass ends.

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

...and may almighty God bless you. The ♥ Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen. The Mass is ended, go in the peace of Christ Thanks be to God.

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We may make the Sign of the Cross as God's blessing is given. The Deacon or Priest then dismisses the people.
